

Conflict Minerals Statement

Inoplas Technology takes very seriously concerns that profits from production of certain minerals in conflict zones may be fuelling human rights abuses in various countries.

In the US, companies that report to the US Security and Exchange Commission (SEC) are subject to the U.S Conflict Minerals legislation contained in Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Reform & Consumer Protection Act. Inoplas Technology Ltd is aware of its responsibilities.

Inoplas Technology Ltd does not directly source or trade in any of the materials covered by the Dodd-Frank legislation. To the best of our knowledge and based on our suppliers' information, products sold by Inoplas Technology are compliant with Dodd-Frank and other regulations and with guidance concerning the sourcing of materials from conflict areas.

We require our suppliers to identify any items which could contain conflict materials. To date we have not identified any use of conflict materials or supply risks in our supply chain.

We will continue to work with our suppliers to verify that our suppliers use conflict free material.
